Our History

On June 1, 1944 the 501st Bombardment Group was activated and in April of 1945 deployed to Guam, where they flew 15 combat missions and airdropped food and supplies to Allied Prisoners of War. On September 15, 1956, the 501st Tactical Missile Wing was established as the first USAF tactical missile wing, then later deactivated on June 18, 1958. The wing was later reactivated as the 501st Tactical Missile Wing on July 1, 1982 but inactivated on May 31, 1991. The wing was later designated as the 501st Combat Support Wing and reactivated on March 22, 2005. The 501st CSW remains the only combat support wing in the USAF, and carries on its storied heritage of generating combat missions around the globe and projecting diplomacy through its ten geographically separated locations across the United Kingdom, Norway, and Cyprus.
